I saw a quote this morning on Bonnie K. Hunter's Quiltville blogspot: "This too shall pass. It may pass like a kidney stone, but it will pass." So, we look forward to the day when our faces can be naked (as in, no mask), and we can hug each other, and share our love of quilting in person!

As I reported in one of our summer newsletters, the Raffle Quilt Committee is now chaired by Donna Brawley and Donna Simpson. The license has been obtained, and the tickets are printed. We are working on a distribution method for tickets to each of our members, so stay tuned! Remember, proceeds from the Raffle Quilt go to Comfort Quilts. Each member of the Guild is asked to sell tickets, as Comfort Quilts is the charitable arm of our organization. Our Webpage administrator, Sue Davies, is putting a picture of the quilt on the website, so keep an eye out for that.

The Quilt Show Challenge fabric has been distributed. It is a very interesting piece of fabric, and the theme this year *is "A Moment in Time"*. Very appropriate for the times we're in! These Challenge mini quilts will be on display in our Tea Room at the Quilt Show.

We are still looking for someone (or more than one!) to spearhead our advertising committee. If you are interested, please let Sarah Roberts know! And a Raffle Basket Draw coordinator. Our members contribute the filled baskets for the draws, which have been very popular in past years. Again, let Sarah know if you are interested. Our Quilt Show is what funds our guild for almost three years. It pays meeting-space rent, hires workshop instructors and program presenters, keeps Comfort Quilts in batting, backing, and thread, pays the cost of liability insurance for all of us who meet, funds our library, buys our coffee for meetings, maintains the website, and seeds the money for our retreats. With a few other miscellaneous things for good measure. We NEED the income the quilt show generates, the guild could not function as it does without it. Please consider this when you are approached to help with the show! Even if all you do is sell a couple books of quilt raffle tickets!

Retreat 2020 Pat Brinklow


Is summer really over? Where has the time gone? We hope you and your family are in good health and that you enjoyed your summer.

The finished quilts will be displayed at our April 2021 meeting for members to vote for "Viewer's Choice". We anticipate that these quilts will be hung in the Tea Room at our 2021 guild show.

Challengers, start your engines!

Editor's note, here is a recap of the rules:

- 1. The challenge is open to all members of the Trent Valley Quilters' Guild.
- 2. The theme is "A Moment in Time".
- 3. A recognizable amount of the challenge fabric is to be used in the FRONT of your guilt.
- 4. The quilt must be presented, completed, including binding or other completed edging, at the April 2021 meeting of the guild for voting on by the membership as a Viewers' Choice.
- 5. Size of quilt, outside measurements, to be a minimum of 75 inches and a maximum of 100 inches.

Kathy Herron shared these tasty sounding recipes with me to add to our newsletter:

Roasted Homemade Spicy Tomato Soup

Roast tomato's, red and/or green, any hot peppers you like, bell peppers and onions, crushed garlic to your taste (I add four big spoons to a pan of tomatoes). Sprinkle with olive oil, salt and pepper! Bake at 400 until charred.

Or...leave out the pepper and add basil, to taste.

I freeze until fall.

For the soup add chicken or vegetable stock cook low / med heat, add a tomato paste (I use the tomato purée in the jar) Purée and simmer until it
