Urban Quilting: This is a comprehensive guide for first time quilters and those looking for a refresher course. Each pattern contains instructions for three different sizes.

Scrap School by Lissa Alexander: Twelve new designs from different designers. Tips and tricks are inside to help you make the most of your fabric stash.

And my favorite title is, "I Might Look Like I'm Listening to you But In My Head I'm Thinking about my next Quilt Project" by Tessa and Lina Fabric. This is a quilting journal but the title is fun.

UFO/PHD is held at the Brighton Community Centre from 9:00 - 3:30 usually the 2nd Friday of the month, with Covid-19 rules in place. Brown bag lunch Lug a mug. The cost for the day is still \$5.00. Snacks are welcome but must be kept at your table because of Covid rules. MASKS MUST BE WORN at all times however when you are sewing at your table masks can be off. If you get up to get a coffee or tea, cut or press fabric, go to chat with someone, using the washroom MASKS ARE ON. Very doable but we will have to think. Handi wipes are available at my table should you need them.

It will take a little longer to enter the hall as we will be following social distancing protocols. The set up committee will come at 8:30 and after them the rest of the group. Entry is from either the north or south doors (the exit doors are not in use). You will be required to social distance while you are waiting to sign in. Please read and agree to the list of questions posted, wear a mask and sign in at either community hall table. If you have someone assisting you with bringing in your machine etc. they also must social distance, sign in the book and be wearing a mask. Also when they return to help you leave. It is best if you have assistance to bring all of your "stuff" into the lobby before signing in. Each time you leave the building i.e setting up, going out to buy your lunch etc. you MUST sanitize, sign in again and be wearing your mask.

Practice social distancing. We are using the full hall. Twelve (12) tables at the north wall and thirteen (13) tables on the south wall. The rows are 3 tables wide. We will have the usual ironing stations and cutting/layout tables.

Limited use of the kitchen to people. Only one (1) person at a time. More sanitizing will take place. We are fortunate to have 2 ladies with their Food Handlers certificate should we need to use it. We can make coffee and tea and use the south frig for lunches. Lunch is taken at your sewing table. Should you use any kitchen cutlery/dishes you must clean & return them yourself.

UFO/PHD Dates: Friday, September 17th, (full) Friday, Oct 8th (13 spaces) Friday, Nov 12th (20 spaces) no UFO/PHD in December.

The dates for 2022 will be posted in the December newsletter.
