Quilt Show 2021 Sarah Roberts

So, with not being able to have a large group meeting, and our Guild meetings cancelled until (hopefully no later than) September, I have a few things I would like people to consider:

1. Our quilt show dates have already been booked, June 4 (set up day), 5 and 6, 2021. I have sent an email to Jim at the community center to double confirm that those dates are not going to be changed due to all of the rearranging that will have to happen once we conquer this virus.

2. Our raffle quilt is a major fund-raiser for Comfort Quilts. It is very important that we start soon to have the necessary licence, bank account, and tickets printed for this. The quilt itself is all done! **WE NEED A RAFFLE QUILT COMMITTEE CONVENOR**! The 2018 Quilt Show raffle quilt convenor, Janet Kivisto, left a detailed manual for whoever takes this on. Please get in touch with me if you are willing to do this very important job.

3. One of the "new" items we would like to include in the 2021 show is a youth category. At our virtual executive meeting, someone made the point that with our kids or grandkids not in school, perhaps a grandma (or grandpa!) or aunt (or uncle) or neighbour (!) could teach them some quilting techniques, and finished projects could be entered in our show. Brilliant! I will put together a separate email outlining the rules for the Canadian Quilters Association entry to their youth category, and hopefully we can inspire a whole new generation of quilters! This idea is not fully explored yet, but as I sit here typing this, I am thinking appropriate prizes might encourage a few entries, too.

4. Committee Convenor positions that are still open are: Advertising, Door Prizes (this may be changed to a different format), Hanging of Quilts, Hanging of small wall hangings, Raffle quilt, Raffle Baskets, Viewers' Choice, and Visual Records. Please contact me if you are willing to take on one of these positions!

5. We would like to have a featured quilter again in 2021. The 2018 show featured Linda Broere, and the 2015 show featured Marilyn Edmonds. Do you have an opinion of who we should "show off" at our show?? Tell me!!

6. Timeline--Registrations for entries for our 2021 show will be available in January, 2021, and are due in February. So while you are cleaning up and sorting through all your treasures, start thinking of what you would like to enter in our show! The entire January 2021 meeting will be devoted to the quilt show, and registration categories and forms for entries will be explained. Keep an eye out for new categories and quantities. More on that in the fall.....

7. Traditionally, May/June are the months when we introduce the small challenge hanging, to be finished by the end of the following April, and voted on by our guild members in May for the "winners". These hangings are used to decorate our tea room during the show. The quilt show committee will consider how we will handle sign up

and distribution of the "required" fabric (or if we can do it on a compressed timeline) for the 2021 show.

8. The block of the month mystery quilt will continue to be distributed, in spite of us not gathering as a whole. Another entry for our show! You can do it!

There, that's lots of stuff for you to think about. Please email me about how excited you are to take on one of the convenor positions, or if you have any questions!


